What is an Apprenticeship

- Around 6 hours per week is dedicated to new learning (off the job training) this may include attending College or University, shadowing colleagues or completing online training
- > Apprenticeship length and start dates vary
- > Gain a qualification between level 2 and level 7
- > End Point Assessment



Funding & Eligibility



- > Apprenticeships are for all ages
- > You can still study for an apprenticeship even if you have other qualifications.
- > Apprentices must be living in the UK for the past 3 years.

Apprentices must not be studying for another qualification through the department of education.

Why should I do an Apprenticeship Portsmouth



- > Great opportunity to change career path.
- > You earn whilst you learn.
- > Costs No university fees to pay Fully funded qualification.
- > Gain a recognised qualification.
- > Better job prospects as you gain the workplace experience not just the qualification. One of the most essential skills in any workplace is networking and connecting with people.
- > You can progress to other higher level apprenticeship qualifications giving you a clear career pathway.
- > Develop your skills, boost your CV and increase your earning potential.





When is the best time to do an Apprenticeship

- > When you feel you can commit to the programme alongside your work.
 - Making sure you have your English and maths qualifications for the level of the apprenticeship is an advantage. This can be completed alongside the apprenticeship, but it is more work. You will need to produce your certification.
- > Apprenticeship Levels 2-5 There are different start dates depending on the apprenticeship you want to take.
- Higher Levels 6-7 Apprenticeships can run with the academic year although universities have usually a couple of intake times per year. You would start applying three to four months prior to this.
- Most providers offer a roll on roll off programme with various start dates throughout the year.






