Route #1 Apprenticeships and training

- Some vacancies in schools will require people to have a C/4 in maths and English
- If you feel you need to gain these qualifications, The Learning Place, HSDC and City of Portsmouth College can support you
- Alternatively, if you would like to undertake an apprenticeship and gain a formal qualification you can go to: <u>findapprenticeship.service.gov.uk</u>
- Other level two and three qualifications are also available



Route #2 Volunteering

- If you need experience before you apply for a job, vólunteering is a good option You will need a basic DBS
- Experience working with children and young people isn't always necessary but looks good on your CV Community groups and other relevant
- organisations can also provide this experience through transferable skills



Route #3 Applying direct

- Check job vacancies to view requirements
- Visit the Portsmouth City Council jobs portal and search for 'school jobs'
- Extend your search to other places including school websites, Indeed.co.uk etc.






Teaching Assistant Apprentice Journey

- You will be supported by the school
- You will be assigned an assessor who will set tasks to be completed
- You will be given 6 hours per week off the job training this may include attending workshops, 1-1 meetings with your assessor, time to complete assignments
- From the 15th month onward, you will begin preparing for the End Point Assessment with full support from your assessor


